

### Comments to FDA on Filtered Milk for Cheese



- FDA reopened comments to finalize rules for use of Ultrafiltered Milk (UF) for cheese
- Standard & Labeling Committee reached agreement to request UF and Microfiltered (MF) milk in fluid forms be allowed for cheese with ingredient labeling as "milk"
- Outreach to NMPF for support and joint comments
- COVID-19 extended comments to August 13, 2020
- Allow more time to gather data to support MF milk and refine our legal arguments for labeling







### Updated on DGA 2020-2025



### Major Goals:

- Maintain dairy as a separate food group
- Maintain recommendation for 3 servings every day

#### **Additional Goals:**

Recommendations include dairy at a range of fat levels

IDFA submitted detailed written comments and provided oral comments on January 23, 2020 to Advisory Committee and agencies

- Pushed back on anti-dairy false claims mispresenting science
- Emphasized lactose free options such as cheese

DGAC <u>Draft</u> Conclusions – Dairy (low fat and fat free) is association with better health outcomes and included in healthy dietary patterns.

Negative for saturated fat and no differentiation for milkfat.

## **Driving U.S. Growth:** Exports to Japan

U.S. Exported \$283 Million in Dairy Products to Japan in 2019

Comprehensive trade agreements that open markets and lower trade barriers are crucial to support the growth of U.S. dairy exports.

#### **Current Trade Barriers**

 Butter, milk powders and other non-tariff issues were excluded in the U.S.-Japan phase one trade deal.

#### Competitor's Advantage

 Comprehensive and Progressive Agreement for Trans-Pacific Partnership (CPTPP) dairy exporters, such as Australia and New Zealand, have the upper hand in exporting dairy to Japan due to lower tariffs for a more inclusive group of products.

#### **IDFA** Position

 A phase two trade agreement with Japan must include: the elimination of tariffs for all dairy products, strong sanitary and phytosanitary measures and protections for common cheese names.
